The *Journal of Nutrition Education and Behavior* serves as a global resource for all professionals with an interest in nutrition education; nutrition and physical activity behavior theories and intervention outcomes; complementary and alternative medicine related to nutrition behaviors; food environment; food, nutrition, and physical activity communication strategies including technology; nutrition-related economics; food safety education; and scholarship of learning related to these areas.

The **Journal of Nutrition Education and Behavior** welcomes evidence-based manuscripts that provide new insights and useful findings related to nutrition education research, practice and policy. The content areas of **JNEB** reflect the diverse interests in nutrition and physical activity related to public health, nutritional sciences, education, behavioral economics, family and consumer sciences, and eHealth, including the interests of community-based nutrition-practitioners. As SNEB's official journal, **JNEB** also includes policy statements, issue perspectives, position papers, and member communications.

Methods Papers in JNEB

JNEB publishes 2 types of Methods papers: Intervention Research Methods and Questionnaire Development Research Methods. Intervention Research Methods manuscripts describe the objectives and methodologies for interventions that aim to change nutrition and/or physical activity behavior and/ or related physiological outcomes, such as BMI or blood glucose. Questionnaire Development Research Methods manuscripts are expected to include formative testing, such as cognitive interviews or pilot-testing; reliability analyses; and content analysis either by expert panel or statistical testing.

Both types of methods papers allow **JNEB** readers to gain an in-depth understanding of how research is conducted, beyond that which is traditionally published in the methods section of a research article.

SPONSORED ARTICLES

Have you considered publishing a Sponsored Article in the Journal of Nutrition Education and Behavior?

Authors are invited to submit individual manuscripts (or content for entire supplemental issues) that are scientifically valid and of interest to the readers of the *Journal of Nutrition Education and Behavior (JNEB)*. Unlike regular manuscript submissions, sponsored articles or issues are "sponsored" with fees, which may be from research grants or contract funds. All fees for the sponsored articles/supplements are negotiated with the publisher, Elsevier, and a contract and/or letter of intent will be completed and signed before the peer-review process begins.

Sponsored manuscripts submitted for publication will undergo the usual peer-review process. Acceptance of supplemental issues is at the discretion of the **JNEB** Editor-in-Chief and the Executive Director of the Society for Nutrition Education and Behavior (SNEB), similar to the **JNEB** policies for advertising. To sponsor a supplement, the topic must be approved by the editor and the invited papers committee. If the topic is mutually agreed upon by the sponsor and editor, a guest editor will be approved by both parties.

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
